



ACCREDITATION FOR NURSES IN ONTARIO (FOR BOTH REGISTERED NURSE RN & REGISTERED PRACTICAL NURSE RPN)

All internationally educated nurses (IEN) will need to submit their documents & credentials to be verified by The National Nursing Assessment Service(NNAS). NNAS was created by Canadian nursing regulators, including the College of Nurses of Ontario, & to offer an easy, direct & secure way for IENs to submit their documents for Canadian nursing registration. After completing the assessment with NNAS, you will be given application & ID numbers.

Registration Requirements:

- 1. Nursing Education;
- 2. Evidence of Practice;
- 3. Registration Examination (Written-multiple choice exam & practical clinical examination);
- 4. Jurisprudence Examination;
- 5. Proficiency in English or French;
- 6. Citizenship, Permanent Residency or Authorization to Practice Nursing
- 7. Past Offences & Findings, must state whether you have ever been found guilty of an offence, refused registration, or are involved in certain proceedings; and
- 8. Health & Conduct, must declare whether you suffer from any physical or mental condition that could affect your ability to practice nursing in a safe manner.
